Winemakers Newsroom



Gone Fishing or Hunting! Back Later! I

think everyone remembers this type of sign on some shops years ago prior to the opening of fishing or hunting or some other season. Well, it's hard to write much this month as we are preparing for our grape arrivals. So far, it looks as if we have avoided being interrupted with smoke or fire problems (as we were last year, cancelling 1/3rd of our grapes)!

By the time this goes to press, we will have distributed about 5,000 lbs. of Merlot grapes and about 250 gallons of Chardonnay juice, both from Sonoma. Mid to late October, we expect 5,500 lbs. of Cabernet Sauvignon, 2,000 lbs. of Petite Sirah, 2,000 lbs. of Primitivo, and a small amount of Zinfandel, 1,500 lbs. or so.

The varietals will be split up by a little short of 30 different winemakers. Some receiving small lots and other large lots, each to make his or her own wines.

This year as last, a service we will provide to our winemakers is the inclusion of all fermentation additives, up to the malolactic fermentation stage.

A special shout out goes to **Bruce Powers** who is managing our grape procurement activity, and also to **Dave Wiegand**, his trusty assistant; the support that these two provide is exceptional! They have managed



all or part of our grape and juice deliveries for about four years now. By the way, both are exceptional winemakers, too! Thanks, guys!

Have I Ordered that Event Yet? My Account Page



We are finding that members sometimes duplicate their sign-ups for an event. When they get the newsletter announcement, they

find a new event that looks like fun and they sign up right away. Then weeks later, when they hear their friends talking about that same wine tasting event, forgetting that they or their membership partner have already signed up, they sign up again. A good practice before signing up for any event is to scan the "My Account" page. This page is accessed from the main menu and has lots of good information about your membership. Near the bottom of the page is an area called "Recent Orders." A quick scan here shows all the OCWS events already purchased. If it is not there, sign up within the "Events" area of the website before all the seats are taken.

All membership type selections are viewable after you have

logged into your account. For example, events are for members only, to sign themselves and their guests up for our wine tastings offerings.

Other good information is listed here and can be performed from "My Account" page.

- Changing your password
- Viewing your membership status
- Using the renewal button to keep your membership current
- Seeing if you have earned a coupon. Your code and amount are listed under the Store Credit area on this page.
- Accessing your Profile page by selecting the "Account Details" button near the top of the page
- It's also a good place to make sure your address information is correct and up to date

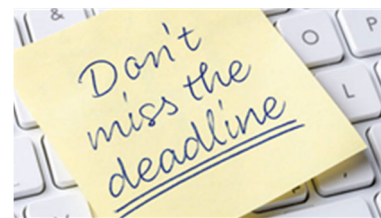
No early checkout is available

This is your last chance to sign up for the 2021 Wine Auction, scheduled for Saturday, October 16, from 11 am to 5 pm in the Costa Mesa Building of the OC Fair & Event Center! This year's auction is being held in the fall and replaces the 2020 Wine Auction which was scheduled for April 2020 and had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. Those who already had tickets to the 2020 event will be able to use those tickets for this year's event. The auction will feature the wines from the 2019 OC Fair Commercial Wine Competition, which have been stored in a temperature and humidity-controlled cellar since June 2019. This is an extraordinary opportunity to purchase some great wines at amazing prices!

The Wine Auction features 1407 silent and 104 verbal auction lots (4 bottles each) from some of the best wines submitted for the Commercial Wine Competition. Enjoy an afternoon of delicious food and wine with your OC Wine Society friends as you bid on your favorite varietals and wineries. Special lots will also be available for purchase without having to bid.

This is your annual opportunity to purchase these wines at a fraction of their retail value. Tickets are only \$20 per member for this **MEMBERS-ONLY** event! Don't forget to bring your

own wine glass and a few pens for bidding. Most importantly, wear comfortable shoes! You must plan to stay for the entire event, as we cannot accommodate early checkouts! We will be adding a new type of checkout through online payment this year to help speed up the process (the standard check and credit card checkouts will still be available).



We also require volunteers for this event. Positions include moving wines, serving wines or food during the event, assisting with checkout, and more. Watch the weekly reminders for the link to volunteer opportunities for the Wine Auction and sign up early.

Please note that this event will be following the COVID protocols outlined by the OC Fair and Event Center. All attendees should be either vaccinated or have a negative COVID test within 72 hours of the event. We ask those who are showing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone who has had COVID within the two weeks prior to the event not to attend. Attendees may choose to wear masks during the event for additional protection.

Gold Medal Mini-Tasting Results

Nearly 170 members and guests attended this year's Gold Medal Mini-Tasting at 14 host sites around the county. The lineup of wines consisted of ten Double Gold winners, served in pairs of the same varietal/style. Three of these wines were also Best of Class.

The blind tasting included five flights of two wines each. The varietals/styles included Viognier, Pinot Noir, Mourvedre (and a Rhone red with Mourvedre as the largest percentage), GSM (Grenache/Syrah/Mourvedre), and Zinfandel. Nine of the 10 wines finished in the top three at one or more sites.

The Gold medal mini-tasting is unique among the mini-tastings in that each flight is a different varietal/style, so the overall scores say more about the attendees' personal preferences than about the wines. Our group clearly loves Zinfandels. The two Zinfandels in the lineup got the highest scores overall (by a wide margin) and the third highest scores (one point behind the second place wine).

4 th	Wood Family Vineyards GSM Livermore Valley AVA	2019	\$36.00	94 pt. Double Gold. Two first, one second, and two third place finishes across the fourteen sites. 17 1 st , 22 2 nd , 19 3 rd place votes on attendees' scorecards.
5 th	Carol Shelton Wines Coquille Rouge Rhone Style Red Central Coast AVA	2019	\$25.00	93 pt. Double Gold. Three first, one second, and one third place finishes across the fourteen sites. 18 1 st , 19 2 nd , 15 3 rd place votes on attendees' scorecards.
6 th	Sculpterra – Repousse' GSM, Paso Robles Estrella District AVA	2019	\$46.00	94 pt. Double Gold. Three second and one third place finishes across the fourteen sites. 10 1 st , 24 2 nd , 19 3 rd place votes on attendees' scorecards.
